Schedule for Monday Night Gatherings

3:00 - Our Load-in Team arrives at Seacoast and prepares the environments for the nights.

5:25 - Volunteers will be expected to arrive by 5:25.

5:30 - Team huddle that we will use to share a quick overview of the night, a devotion, and anything else volunteers need to know.

5:45 - We will pray and worship together. This will be a time to pray for one another and worship together, preparing our hearts for the night and giving us the opportunity to do life together.

5:55 - Volunteers in positions

6:00 - Doors open and volunteers will be ready to serve our guests. We will use this time to fellowship and eat together.

6:10 - Five minute counter drops and Welcomer shares announcements.

6:15 - Worship starts

6:25 - Message starts

7:00 - Invitation and prayer time

7:15 - Small groups start

8:15 - Cleanup starts

9:30 - We're locking up the building


Gathering Location

Our gathering location will continue to be at Seacoast in West Ashley. We are very excited to be able to gather in the newly renovated Warehouse.

We are not allowing people to enter the building through the front of

Seacoast and will discourage traffic past the bathrooms from the

Multi-Purpose Room. Here is a map of where to go and where to park.



Small Group Locations

The Family (Codependency) group, will be located in the Glass Cafe. The Community and Growth group will meet in the Meeting room. Those two groups are the only people who need to go past the bathrooms. The Men's and Women's addiction group will be in the Warehouse. Once it cools down in the Fall, one group will be relocated to the deck.

Ticketing Procedure

35 tickets will be available for each gathering. If someone comes to a gathering without a ticket. The volunteer who greets them needs to go to www.thehopeproject.cc/rsvp and get them one. If all 35 tickets are sold out, we can allow seven more people in (42 total). If we are at max capacity, we will have Chick-fil-a gift cards for people who we are not able to admit to

the gathering and will recommend that they get dinner and watch the live gathering from their phone.

Safety Precautions

We take the health of our volunteers and guests very seriously! That being said, we are taking every precaution necessary to keep everyone safe.

- Each person will get their temperature taken with an Infrared No-Touch Forehead Thermometer at the entrance to our gatherings. Anyone with a temperature of 99.9 degrees will be given a Chick-fil-a gift card and be encouraged to go home and watch the message online.
- Masks will be mandatory when inside the building for guests and volunteers. People will be encouraged to bring their own mask, but if they do not have one we will provide them with one. Masks do not have to be worn outside but everyone will be encouraged to social distance.
- Upon entrance, hand sanitizer will be offered to each guest. It will also be available on the food table, in the bathroom, and at the Resource Center.
- Rows of chairs will be spaced apart and everyone will be encouraged to sit with the people they normally do everyday life with.
- All doors need to be manned or propped open to eliminate touch points.
- We will have a man and a woman volunteer cleaning bathrooms and common spaces throughout the night.
- We will not return any of the items we use for our gatherings to the storage closets. Seacoast has asked that we leave them out in order for their cleaning team to do it. There will be no need for us to plan to stay late and clean. The Lead Facility team has put responsibility of cleaning on the staff teams to ensure effectiveness.

- Any room that is closed, we will not be entering. The only rooms that we should be in are the Multi-Purpose Room, the Glass Cafe, the men's and women;s bathrooms, and the hallways in between.

Food Serving Procedure

We will be serving Chick-fil-a for the time being. Each meal will come prepackaged to lower the chance of spreading germs. We will also have bottles of water for each guest. Our Hospitality Team should be the only ones handling the boxes of food and bottles of water. They are asked to wash and sanitize their hands before doing so.. Each guest gets one box of food.

Message and Small Group Procedure

The message will be live on Monday's, however the messages will still be streamed live for those who can't make it, live outside of SC, or just don't feel safe coming back.

Small groups will be in person, on site at Seacoast. We will still offer the ability for people to join in through a Zoom chat. If no one shows up for the first ten minutes of the group, the chat can be closed if small group leaders see fit.

Resource Table

The Resource table will still be a physical location and guests will be asked to check it out. The resources themselves will be in containers located outside. We're doing this in order to cut down on the spreading of germs. Volunteers at the table should be knowledgeable on all of the resources that we offer and be able to suggest some resources to the guest based on conclusions drawn from an organic conversation. Some common questions will be, "Do you have a Bible? What are you currently struggling with right now, i.e. codependency, addiction? What is your drug of choice? Have you gone through the twelve steps? Are you interested in detox?" The answers

to these questions will help the volunteer to decide which resources are best for the guest.

First Time Guest Procedure

First time guests will be met by smiling greeters who will build relationships with them by getting to know them, while giving them a tour of our gathering location. As the volunteer builds an organic friendship, he or she will ask the first time guest to go to: www.thehopeproject.cc/ftg to fill out the short Welcome form. Asking them fairly early in the conversation to fill out the form will ensure that they fill it out. This is a very important component of what we do and should be strongly encouraged. This allows us to follow up with them and get to know and serve them well.

Care and Prayer

We will continue to have an invitation at the end of each message. There will be a call for salvation and a call for prayer. If people need prayer, we will have them go to www.thehopeproject.cc/prayer to fill out our care and prayer request form. We will encourage them to get prayer in their small groups after the message as well to cut down on people being exposed to germs.
